

### Phase Two COVID Response Grants Awarded August 21, 2020

The following grants were awarded by the Community Foundation in our second phase of COVID-19 response grantmaking. The framework provides two types of grants: **Critical Needs Grants** for preventing and mitigating the impacts of job and income loss and challenges with meeting basic living expenses are awarded in amounts up to \$25,000; and **Operational Grants** for operational support to help nonprofits bridge the COVID crisis and continue providing vital community services are awarded in amounts up to \$5,000.
