



## LGBTQ Fund of the Community Foundation of Greater Birmingham 2022 Grantees:

- AIDS Alabama \$6,000 to form a Youth Action Committee in collaboration with One Roof to
  elevate the voices of those with lived experience in designing a Continuum of Care plan to end
  youth homelessness.
- AIDS Alabama: Alabama Latino AIDS Coalition (ALAC) \$5,000 to host the 2<sup>nd</sup> annual LGBTQ Latinx conference for empowerment, leadership, LGBTQ+ advocacy and wellness for individuals and families.
- AlaQuest Collaborative for Education \$5,000 to educate and empower LGBTQ+ persons to serve as leaders in positive social change. Scholarships will be provided to LGBTQ+ Anytown delegates and a staff intern, lifting visibility of LGBTQ+ people, encouraging self-confidence, and supporting an inclusive society.
- **Birmingham Aids Outreach (BAO)** \$5,000 to provide monthly mental health support through regular self-care, health and wellness workshops for youth and young adults at the Magic City Acceptance Center.
- Birmingham Black Repertory Theatre Collective (BBRTC) \$6,000 to support the cost of a
  production elevating the work of queer BIPOC artists in its 4<sup>th</sup> year of bringing high-quality
  mainstage performances to the community.
- **Great Heights, Inc. dba Creative Wellness Institute \$6,000** to provide access to mental health counseling services with licensed practitioners to LGBTQ+ individuals, children, couples and families on a sliding fee scale through the FamilyCare Initiative.
- Hispanic Interest Coalition of Alabama \$3,500 to foster collaboration with organizations
  directly serving the LGBTQ+ community with the goal of becoming a more visible ally of the
  Hispanic LGBTQ+ community.
- Innovation Depot \$4,000 to provide business and startup support specific to LGBBTQ+ small business owners, entrepreneurs, founders and the entrepre-curious through a conference structured to create a sense of belonging and empower founders with the tools they need to succeed.
- Invisible Histories Project \$4,000 to record and preserve the stories of 10 local Black LGBTQ+ leaders, entertainers and community members through the Dream in Color project which will include interviews, donated archival materials and a documentary film.
- Magic City Acceptance Academy \$10,000 to build a curriculum promoting civic engagement
  for junior and senior students. The Bland Civic Engagement Initiative will work to give young
  people the skills they need to advocate for change and social justice through 4 defined
  constructs: Civic Action, Civic Commitment, Civic Skill-building and Social Cohesion.
- **Teach for America Alabama \$5,000** to equip teachers with resources and strategies to support individuals in schools who identify as LGBTQ+, creating inclusive classrooms, assisting schools/communities/families in supporting students, and building a cadre of allies.
- Unitarian Universalist Church for Southside Faith Communities \$2,500 NEW to further the interfaith clergy group's tangible support for trans children and their families, demonstrating that persons of faith affirm and welcome LGBTQ+ persons wholly and unequivocally.
- University of Montevallo \$5,000 to provide emergency monetary assistance to students in unexpected financial hardship as a result of their LGBTQ+ identity. The Safe Zone Fund will be administered through UM Counseling Services and the CARE Team's confidential intervention procedures.
